

B-galactosidase (B-gal), a protein product of the bacterial LacZ gene, catalyzes the conversion of B-galactosides into monosaccharides. B-gal is a common marker gene used to assess transfection efficiency.

This mRNA is capped using CleanCap™, TriLink's proprietary co-transcriptional capping method, which results in the naturally occurring Cap 1 structure with high capping efficiency. It is polyadenylated and optimized for mammalian systems. It mimics a fully processed mature mRNA.

Handling

Store at or below -40°C. Thaw and work with Beta gal mRNA on ice. Upon first use, pulse spin before opening and aliquot into single use portions. Do not vortex. Use only certified RNase-free reagents and consumables with proper RNase-free technique. Use of barrier tips is recommended. Avoid freeze/thaw cycles. Do not mix with media containing serum unless first complexed with a stabilizing transfection reagent.
